Alexander E. Teodosio
March 21, 1924 – February 10, 2015

Al was born to parents, Rose (Battaglia) and Alexander Teodosio in Connecticut. He graduated from High School in 1942 and joined the U.S. Army Air Forces serving as a Staff Sergeant in the South Pacific during World War II. Following the end of the war he was honorably discharged and returned to Connecticut where he met his future wife, Anna Marie Tiano. He attended New York University and Brooklyn Law School where he received his Juris Doctorate. While in law school, he and Anna Marie were married. Al graduated law school as the senior class president and went on to pass both the New York and Ohio Bar Exams.

Following his licensure, he and his wife began their family in Akron. He joined his oldest brother Ernest in the law firm of Teodosio & Teodosio and also served as Assistant Attorney General during this time. He pursued his interests which included Summit County politics. He served as Chairman of the Summit County Democratic Party from 1976 to 1990 and was twice named Democrat of the Year for the Summit County Democratic Party and Democrat of the Year for the Ohio Democratic Party in 1983. Al retired from the law firm of Teodosio, Cherpas, Manos and Ward. Following his retirement, he enjoyed spending winters in Florida. Al was a member of the Akron and Ohio State Bar Associations and served as President of the Holy Name Society. He was also a member of the Sons of Italy, Toastmasters and Knights of Columbus. Al was an avid tennis player, and enjoyed carpentry, bowling, dancing and talking politics and a true inspiration to all that knew him.

He mentored many young lawyers and professionals and helped start their careers. He was proud of his children and grandchildren, celebrating each of their accomplishments and loved spending time with his family during Sunday afternoon dinners.

Profession of Faith

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
